NATURE OF ACTIVITY	
	The proposed management action will grant units of fishing capacity (quota units) to the traditional inhabitant sector (TIB)(to be held by the Torres Strait Regional Authority), and to principal licence holders in the Transferable Vessel Holder (TVH) sector of the Torres Strait Tropical Rock Lobster Fishery (TRL Fishery).
	The proposed management action will create 1,000,000 quota units. The units will be split between the TIB and TVH sector with 562,000 (56.2%) units allocated to the TSRA, to hold for the benefit of the TIB sector, and 438,000 (43.8%) quota units to be allocated to principal licence holders in the TVH sector.

Background Information

What will the proposed management option involve?

- 1. The Torres Strait Fisheries (Quotas for Tropical Rock Lobster (Kaiar)) Management Plan 2018 (the Plan) legislates in section 15 that 1,000,000 quota units be allocated within the Torres Strait Tropical Rock Lobster Fishery (TRL Fishery) on the allocation day.
- 2. The quota units in the TRL Fishery will be divided between the traditional inhabitant (TIB) and transferable vessel holder (TVH) sectors. On the allocation day, 562 000 quota units will be allocated to the Torres Strait Regional Authority to hold on behalf of the traditional inhabitant sector, and 438 000 quota units will be allocated to principal licence holders in the transferable vessel holder (TVH) sector of the TRL Fishery.
- 3. The TSRA is the principal licence holder of three TVH primary boat licences. Consequently, some of the 438 000 quota units allocated to the TVH sector will be allocated to the TSRA. This will increase the number of quota units being held for the TIB sector.
- 4. For further information on the Plan and how it will operate, please refer to the Plan and it's explanatory statement (**Attachment B**) and the Guide to the Plan (**Attachment E**).

Why is this management option being proposed?

- 5. On 26 November 2018, the Protected Zone Joint Authority, having considered the outcomes of public consultation, determined the Plan. The Plan came into force on 1 December 2018.
- 6. The Plan legislates a quota management and allocation process for the TRL Fishery. The allocation of quota units to the TVH sector (the subject of this notification) is a legislative requirement under the Plan.

How will the proposed management option benefit Traditional inhabitants.

- 7. The PZJA acknowledges and supports the aspirations of traditional inhabitants of the Protected Zone to increase their ownership of commercial fishing access in the Tropical Rock Lobster (TRL) fishery to 100 per cent, an aspiration that extends to all commercial fisheries in the Torres Strait. The Management Plan establishes a quota management system that will, amongst other things, provide a mechanism for Traditional Inhabitants to increase their ownership of commercial fishing access in the TRL fishery to 100 per cent.
- 8. This Management Plan pursues the objectives of the *Torres Strait Fisheries Act 1984* (the Act), and aims at improving Torres Strait Islander and Aboriginal people's access to opportunities to improve long-term interests, as well as regional economic development and livelihood by creating more secure access rights and a mechanism for further reallocation. As a result of Australian Government funded voluntary buyouts of TRL fishing licenses since 2007, the Management Plan can immediately deliver the majority share of the TRL quota allocation to traditional inhabitants.
- 9. Confirming majority commercial access to the fishery by traditional inhabitants enhances the opportunity for traditional Torres Strait Islander and Aboriginal people in the region to take a primary interest in the guardianship and use of fisheries resources for the betterment of customary, social and economic development needs.
