

^A Catch reported through TDB02 Catch Disposal Records (CDRs) and does not include any unreported catches or outstanding catches (there is an expected processing delay of 2-3 weeks from when a Fish Receiver completes a CDR and AFMA receives and processes it). All catch data reported as 'tails' is converted to whole weight using the conversion factor of 2.677.

[#] The start of season TAC of 200 tonnes tropical rock lobster in the Australian waters of the TRL fishery was determined on 4 October 2022. The TACs displayed for each sector above are calculated based on the total number of quota units available to each sector as determined under the *Torres Strait Fisheries (Quotas for Tropical Rock Lobster (Kaiar)) Management Plan 2018*.

* In accordance with AFMA's Information Disclosure Policy, catch amounts have not bee provided as the catch reported in from less than 5 boats. AFMA continues to closely monitor individual catches against quota holdings.
