#### Comment on a proposed management action in line with section 24HA(2) of the Native Title Act 1993

I am writing to you on behalf of the Secretariat of the Protected Zone Joint Authority (PZJA) regarding the proposed management action to make changes to an existing Fisheries Management Instrument which requires fishers to use specific Bycatch Reduction Devices (BRDs) in fishing nets in the Torres Strait Prawn Fishery.

This proposal seeks the continuation of existing requirements to use bycatch reduction devices, however, makes some recommendations to change which devices can be used. The proposed changes would introduce new BRDs that have been found to be more effective at reducing fish bycatch than some older style BRDs, remove some older style BRDs and make changes to a few others to make them consistent with rules in the neighbouring Queensland East Coast Otter Trawl Fishery.

#### **Background Information**

#### What does this instrument do?

This notice is related to the proposal to remake the existing Fisheries Management Instrument for the Torres Strait Prawn Fishery, which requires all Torres Strait Prawn fishers to use bycatch reduction devices in all nets used for fishing. This proposal seeks the continuation of existing requirements to use bycatch reduction devices, however makes some recommendations to change which devices can be used.

## What are the proposed changes to Fisheries Logbook Instrument

The proposed changes would introduce three new BRDs that have been found to be more effective at reducing fish bycatch than some older style BRDs. These results were found in both trials in the Torres Strait Prawn Fishery in 2019, 2020 and 2022 and trials in the Northern Prawn Fishery. The instrument will also remove four older style BRDs that are less effective. The final recommended change is to two existing BRDs which will still be allowed in the fishery, as are still considered effective at reducing bycatch. Minor changes are suggested to bring them into alignment with the Queensland East Cost Otter Trawl Fishery rules for these two BRDs. At the moment, the requirements in the Queensland ECOTF are slightly more conservative than the TSPF, so these changes would be adopted to ensure the rules are the same in both fisheries. Most fishers are already using BRDs that meet these more conservative rules given they fish in both the TSPF and Queensland ECOTF. These changes have been recommended by the Torres Strait Prawn Management Advisory Committee which includes expert Torres Strait Traditional Inhabitant Industry members, commercial fisheries and Government officials from the Australian Fisheries Management Authority, Torres Strait Regional Authority and Queensland Fisheries.
