Agenda Item 1: Preliminaries

The Chair opened the meeting and welcomed all attendees. Mr Charles David acknowledged the traditional owners of the Cairns/Trinity Inlet region (Gimuy Yidingi).

The agenda for the meeting was adopted without revision.

Agenda Item 1.3 Correspondence

The Committee noted the following inwards correspondence.

1) Mark Hamman. '*Population structure and genetic composition of green turtles sold in the Daru market*'

The Committee requires further clarification on certain aspects of this project and will endeavour to resolve these with the PI out of session so that funding can be finalised and research can commence (**ACTION ITEM 1**).

Points for clarification:

- Milestones will be included in the contract prepared with the research provider to measure progress and mitigate problems should they arise. For example: Milestone 1 should be to obtain permission from PNG to conduct the research. If initial sampling in Daru presents problems with authorities, the PI will inform AFMA and funding for the project will be reviewed.
- Provide detail on how communities will be educated regarding the use of genetics to monitor turtle populations. The TSSAC would like more specific detail on how the workshop will disseminate information back into the community. The Committee would also like confirmation that any issues and information arising from the project will be addressed at the workshop and discussions will be held as to how the results will feed into the management of the resource.

The committee was concerned that official recognition of the project from PNG authorities had not been sought. It was suggested that a letter from the Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC) in PNG approving the project or indicating their knowledge of the research would be needed before sampling began. This requirement would meet the milestones suggested above. To progress this, the TSSAC suggested that a letter be drafted for Augustine Mohiba (PNG, NFA) to send to Mark Hamman acknowledging the project, carbon copied through the DEC. (**ACTION ITEM 2**)

The Committee was informed by the lama representative that constructive community meetings regarding other turtle research have been facilitated through Frank Loban and TSRA and Traditional Inhabitants of Daru and coastal villages supported this research. More information about these community consultations will be collected by TSRA to disseminate to TSSAC members out of session (**ACTION ITEM 3**).

2) Tim Skewes '*Sustainable Harvest Strategies for the Torres Strait Hand Collectable Fisheries*'

The final document was to be presented at TSSAC 50 but due to delays only a brief update was provided which was discussed further at agenda item 3.1.

The TSSAC agreed to continue to communicate with Tim Skewes on the progress of the final report and provide the report to TSSAC members when it is available.

3) Professor Nakata '*Cultural Protocols for Researchers Working in the Torres Strait*' was provided by the PI Professor Martin Nakata.



The report was to be presented at TSSAC 50 but was unavailable due to last minute additions. The project was discussed further under agenda item 3.2.

The TSSAC agreed to continue to communicate with Professor Nakata on the progress of the final report and provide the report to TSSAC members when it is available.

Agenda Item 1.4 Ratification of TSSAC 49 Minutes

1.4.1 The committee **AGREED** to accept the minutes of TSSAC 49 as a true and accurate record of the meeting.

Agenda Item 1.5 Action Items from Previous Meeting

The TSSAC noted the progress of Action Items from TSSAC meeting No. 49 with the following comments discussed:

Action Item 6: The issues of PNG funding for research was discussed at the bi-lateral meeting held in Madang in September 2009. PNG have funds available for Bêche de Mer and hand collectables research but there is no clear process to follow to provide the funding to the researchers.

Action Item 15: Calls for research pre-proposals have been completed, however, it was discussed whether the document in progress, '*Cultural Protocols for Researchers Working in the Torres Strait*' should be included in this process. The document will be unavailable for 2009 proposals but all future calls for pre-proposals and proposals will refer the Principal Investigator to this document.

The Iama Island representative indicated that there were concerns with TSSAC Operational Plan (OP) and Strategic Research Plan (SRP). CFG representatives are requesting consultation regarding sea claims and do not want the documents finalised until this has taken place. The TSSAC feel that the SRP and OP are documents with the purpose of guiding the Committee on prioritising research and their scope does not include sea claims at this time. There has also been time for consultation (over 6 months) as TSSAC members were requested to review the documents including their constituent's comments. The documents were finalised at TSSAC 49 and have been distributed to the public.

It was re-iterated that the SRP are living documents with a 5 year review period, while the OP will be updated annually and consultation and feedback is always welcome. In the interests of not delaying research, it was decided to leave the documents as they are for the up-coming round of proposals with the inclusion of the document '*Cultural Protocols for Researchers Working in the Torres Strait*'. Consultation regarding the documents will continue, with TSRA involvement to help resolve the issue.

Any outstanding Action Items were rolled-over to action items from this meeting.

Agenda Item 2 TSSAC Procedures

Agenda Item 2.1 Consideration of Report "Framework for delivering cost effective research to AFMA"

The Committee noted the information provided in the document '*Framework for delivering cost effective research to AFMA*'. The document outlines the cost-benefit analyses needed in order to objectively assess fisheries research. The TSSAC agreed to consider and apply the general framework where possible but noted that Torres Strait fisheries have many differences to other Commonwealth fisheries, in particular the importance of social and



cultural aspects that influence the decisions of the TSSAC. Information is also provided in the Torres Strait Fisheries Act regarding the objectives of the Torres Strait such as "to acknowledge and protect the traditional way of life and livelihood of traditional inhabitants".

The TSSAC will write to AFMA thanking them for the information provided in the document '*framework for delivering cost effective research to AFMA*', requesting guidance as to how it may be useful to Torres Strait fisheries and indicating that the TSSAC will apply the general framework where possible to Torres Strait research (**ACTION ITEM 4**).

Agenda Item 3 TSSAC Current Project Update

Agenda Item 3.1 Sustainable Harvest Strategies for the Torres Strait Hand Collectable Fisheries (PI Tim Skewes)

The full report for this project was not available but a summary was provided.

The research found concerning numbers of Crown of Thorns starfish in the survey area. Interim results indicate that abundance of Black Teatfish has increased and the researchers will be recommending a conservative increase in Total Allowable Catch (TAC) for this species. Other medium to high value species of Bêche de Mer were also found to have stable or increased densities since the previous surveys. Trochus was found to be in "healthy" levels of abundance although CSIRO will recommend lowering the TAC to 100 t (from 150 t) to better reflect a sustainable TAC for this species.

These results will be useful in PNG fisheries management as it demonstrates the effectiveness of fisheries closures in rehabilitating stock. PNG supports collaboration for Bêche de Mer research around Warrior reef and are willing to fund research in their jurisdiction to match research undertaken in the Australian jurisdiction.

Discussions will be held regarding increases in the TAC as part of the community-based harvest strategies (CBHS) currently being developed for the Torres Strait hand collectable fisheries. For the PZJA to increase the TAC, CBHS must be in place so that it can be a sustainable fishery, a requisite to obtain WTO endorsement from DEWHA.

The Committee requested that information be sought from the communities where research was undertaken to ascertain their responses to the research (**ACTION ITEM 5**).

The lama representative requested that community members from lama be involved in training and research when future research is conducted on Warriar reef. He was informed that only Torres Strait Islanders from the area where the research was being undertaken would be involved as per current protocols.

The final report for the project '*Sustainable Harvest Strategies for the Torres Strait Hand Collectable Fisheries*' to be distributed to TSSAC members when available and discussions held as to how the report can be distributed more broadly (**ACTION ITEM 6**).

Agenda Item 3.2 Cultural Protocols for Researchers Working in the Torres Strait (PI Martin Nakata)

Professor Nakata has requested a deadline extension for the final draft document as he is incorporating information from a recently released relevant document. The Committee extended the deadline for the draft submission to the 31 October 2009 and will inform Professor Nakata (**ACTION ITEM 7**).



Once provided to the TSSAC, the draft document will be available for public comment until 31 December. TSRA will distribute the draft document by e-mail and fax to council members and CFGs for each community for comment (state clearly that it is for comment only) **(ACTION ITEM 8)**. AFMA will make the document available to other stakeholders for comment (state clearly that it is for comment only) **(ACTION ITEM 9)**.

All comments received will be considered at TSSAC 51 in March 2010. The TSSAC requested that Professor Nakata be present at TSSAC 51 to discuss and incorporate any comments into the final document '*Cultural Protocols for Researchers Working in the Torres Strait*' if appropriate **(ACTION ITEM 10)**. The finalised document will then be provided to researchers submitting pre and full proposals for their guidance.

The lama representative indicated that Torres Strait Islanders had some concerns with the document but did not wish to elaborate until he had seen the document.

Agenda Item 3.3 International Indigenous Commercial Fisheries Forum

The Committee noted the preliminary work done to seek potential funding providers and interest in holding an international indigenous commercial fisheries forum. Substantial interest in funding the project was put forth by the Food and Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations (FAO) and Norway, albeit with a broader focus to the forum than was originally discussed. The TSSAC reconfirmed its strong support for this initiative.

In principal support will now be requested of relevant bodies such as AFMA, TSRA as the Torres Strait Islander representative body, Papua New Guinea National Fisheries Authority (PNGNFA) and others to determine if the initiative will be developed further **(ACTION ITEM 11)**. In principle interest is extremely desirable from a Torres Strait Islander organisation for other organisations such as FAO to fund the initiative. Further work will be undertaken by the steering committee to secure funding and develop details for the forum **(ACTION ITEM 12)**.

Torres Strait Island communities and PNG are interested in the forum and support the initiative. The focus of the workshop will be to gather international experts on indigenous entrepreneurship to share their knowledge and expertise with Torres Strait Islanders. There is a concern that it is now becoming a much bigger event and has a focus wider than just the Torres Strait and the international aspect may prompt DAFF involvement.

Agenda Item 4 Proposals for Assessment

The TSSAC identified the lack of a simple budget table in the full proposal template and will edit the template to include this **(ACTION ITEM 13)**. It was also requested that a recurring agenda item on budgets is included at future TSSAC meetings allowing for an update on the current budget available for proposals **(ACTION ITEM 14)**. The current budget for the 2009/2010 financial year was discussed under agenda item 5 as other business.

Agenda Item 4 Final Proposal Assessment for 09/2010 Financial Year

The Committee considered an amended full proposal, *Refined Stock assessment and TAC estimation for the Torres Strait rock lobster (TRL) fishery* (PI: Dr Eva Plaganyi-Lloyd (CSIRO)). Dr Plaganyi-Lloyd had received in principle support at TSSAC 48 and was required to address certain specified issues identified by the Committee and submit a revised proposal. The Committee agreed that the revised proposal had fully addressed these issues. However, the Committee required more detail on the costs for each component of the research and would like an indication of costs taking into account future employment of Torres Strait Islanders. The TSSAC recognised the need for the research in some form to inform the Stock



Assessment process for when the TRL fishery is managed under quota. It was also felt that this research complements the research proposal regarding the development of an MSE for the TRL fishery.

4.1.1 The TSSAC **RECOMMEND** the proposal *Refined Stock assessment and TAC estimation for the Torres Strait rock lobster (TRL) fishery* for funding, subject to amendments.

- Provide more detail on the costs for each component.
- Include any potential changes in the budget given the future increase of Torres Strait Islander employment to undertake research in the future.
- A document detailing protocols for researchers working in the Torres Strait is currently being developed by Professor Martin Nakata. The final document will be released as soon as possible to potential researchers working in the Torres Strait. However, in the interim, this draft will be provided to the principal investigator to consider when writing the full proposal.

Agenda Item 4.2 Pre-proposals Assessment 2010/2011

The Committee assessed five (5) submitted pre-proposals for funding starting in the 2010/2011 AFMA Research Fund budget:

1. *An Integrated Management Strategy Evaluation (MSE) for the Torres Strait tropical rock lobster population* – Principal Investigator (PI): Dr Eva Plaganyi-Lloyd (CSIRO).
2. *Recovery of the *Holothuria scabra* (sandfish) population on Warrier Reef, Torres Strait* – PI: Mr Tim Skewes (CSIRO).
3. *Bycatch reduction in the Torres Strait tiger prawn fishery* – PI: Mr David Maynar and Dr Troy Gaston (AMC).
4. *Freshwater and estuarine Fishes of the Torres Strait Islands: A Focus on preventing pest species invasions* - PI Brendan Ebner, Australian Rivers Institute.
5. *Scoping research aimed at cost-effective management of the TSPF* - PI Clive Turnbull, QDPI&F.

Two of the five submitted pre-proposals were recommended by the Committee for further consideration and the Principle Investigators will be asked to submit a full proposal to the TSSAC by 19th February 2010. Each of these proposals must address specific criteria discussed and determined by the Committee in their full proposals, in addition to a number of project-specific comments and recommendations made by the Committee.

4.2.1 The TSSAC **AGREED** to request the Principal Investigators of the following pre-proposals to submit a full proposal to TSSAC 51:

1. *An Integrated Management Strategy Evaluation (MSE) for the Torres Strait tropical rock lobster population* – Principal Investigator (PI): Dr Eva Plaganyi-Lloyd (CSIRO).
2. *Recovery of the *Holothuria scabra* (sandfish) population on Warrier Reef, Torres Strait* – PI: Mr Tim Skewes (CSIRO).

The Secretariat will write to the successful PIs with the comments provided by the TSSAC and request that they submit a full proposal to the TSSAC for consideration at TSSAC 51 (**ACTION ITEM 15**).



The TSSAC secretariat will advise unsuccessful PIs of the decision of the TSSAC to not support their project for further consideration at this time (**ACTION ITEM 16**).

A further research proposal considered by the TSSAC, *Bycatch reduction in the Torres Strait tiger prawn fishery* – PI: Mr David Maynar and Dr Troy Gaston (AMC) was considered appropriate for funding, but the TSSAC would not be recommending the project to AFMA for funding as it is not a research priority for the TSSAC. The Committee agreed to provide their recommendation for the project to the PI with comments that they may wish to address in applications to other funding bodies.

The Committee decided that those invited to submit full proposals would be made aware of the document '*Cultural Protocols for Researchers Working in the Torres Strait*' and that the daft will be provided to the principal investigator to consider when writing the full proposal.

Agenda Item 5 Other business

Budget update

The Committee discussed the budget given the amount of funds available for this financial year, taking into account funds already committed to previous projects spanning several years. The yearly budget will be distributed to TSSAC members as an attachment to the TSSAC 50 draft minutes (**ACTION ITEM 17**).

Some unspent funds were identified for the 2009/2010 financial year. Possible uses for these funds include training extra Torres Strait Islanders for CSIRO research or contributing to the initiatives identified in the forum on to overcome impediments in engaging Torres Strait Islanders in research held in February 2009.

Further discussion regarding the initiatives identified at this forum indicated that there is still no Torres Strait Islander representative body willing to champion the project and AMFA cannot continue to take the lead. Leadership of the project by a Torres Strait Islander representative body would allow for a long-term strategic view in involving islanders in research and provide a single entity to develop experience and qualifications in providing this opportunity. It was re-iterated that no financial commitment from TSRA is need to lead the project but FRDC funding requires a Torres Strait Islander organisation to be involved in order for funding to be provided. Initially, the organisation would need funding of \$5000 to develop a proposal requesting further funding for future stages of the business plan. AFMA will discuss with TSRA the diver training and other initiatives for TSI that have not progressed due to the lack of commitment from a Torres Strait Islander representative body (**ACTION ITEM 18**).

Another initiative to use TSSAC funds was the development of an education program on lobster biology and marine science for students on Thursday Island. It was felt that wider education of Torres Strait Islanders regarding the management of the TRL fishery is important in creating broader knowledge and understanding of the science behind fisheries management. The feasibility of this will be discussed with James Cook University, Thursday Island and the Thursday Island high school (**ACTION ITEM 19**).

Agenda Item 5.1 PNG Hand Collectables

PNG continue to collect length-frequency data for TRL. This information is considered important to the management of fisheries in PNG and Australia. No research is currently underway for Prawn and Spanish mackerel but PNG indicated willingness to fund research in the PNG jurisdiction to match any research undertaken by AFMA in the Australian jurisdiction with the view to share results.



Total Bêche de Mer fisheries closures across all provinces in PNG will continue for the next 3 years. In general, there has been support for the closures by the public but there still remain some problems with processors complying with the closure. PNG considered Bêche de Mer surveys at the beginning of the closure to be very important and are interested in collaborating with researchers conducting surveys of Warrior Reef which are currently being proposed. The surveys would identify fixed transects that would be surveyed annually or bi-annually to monitor stock recovery.

Agenda Item 5.2 Climate Change

The Committee noted the lack of research on potential impacts of climate change in the Torres Strait including fisheries impacts, impacts on lobster larvae, acidification of sea water and the effect on lobster skeletons and the effect on recruitment of species through increases in temperature. The TSSAC discussed the need for research on the ecosystem effects of climate change in the Torres Strait and subsequent impacts on fisheries. It was proposed that discussions with the AFMA research department and DAFF may yield some broad suggestions on potential strategies the TSSAC can use to address climate change.

Fine scale climate modelling currently underway in Hobart is studying the possible changes in water temperature and salinity levels due to climate change. It was agreed that the results of this research need to be viewed before looking at the possible effects climate change will have on key species and habitats in the Torres Strait. Research results should be available by the end of the year and the TSSAC will obtain a copy of the report to discuss at future meetings (**ACTION ITEM 20**).

TSRA informed the TSSAC that they are undertaking climate change work in the Torres Strait.

Agenda Item 5.3 Confirmation of TSSAC 51
